What is ACCESS for ELLs?

- State English Language Development Assessment for all K-12 Multilingual Learners
- Administered annually in February and March, results in June
- Tests four domains in four separate sub-tests:
 - Listening, Speaking, Reading and Writing
- Aligned to WIDA standards
- Six language proficiency levels
- Cut-score of 4.5 in addition to teacher recommendation is needed to exit ML status.

How are ACCESS scores computed?

- Oral Language 50% Listening + 50% Speaking
- Literacy 50% Reading + 50% Writing
- Comprehension 70% Reading + 30% Listening
- Overall Score 35% Reading + 35% Writing+ 15% Listening + 15%Speaking





Who is tested?

- All Multilingual students K-12
- Multilingual students are identified upon registering in our district per state guidelines.
- Multilingual students may be placed in:
 - Full-Time Bilingual programs
 - Sheltered Instruction programs General Education + ESL
 - General Education if parents refuse English language programs





Distribution by Achievement Levels (All Grades)




Distribution by Achievement Levels (All Grades)








Kindergarten ACCESS Performance Level by School








Grade 1 ACCESS Performance Level by School








Grade 2 ACCESS Performance Level by School








Grade 3 ACCESS Performance Level by School



HMS ACCESS Performance Levels









Notable Achievements at the Secondary Level

- Increase in students at the Developing level in Grade 6.
- An average of 21.5% of students went up in Language Proficiency Level.
- An average of 30.8% of students went up in Writing proficiency, with Grade 7 achieving the most gains at 48%.
- 57% of students in Grade 9 went up at least one level from one year to the next.
- 63% of Grade 9 students went up in one or more levels.
