## Reviewing the Process for the HMH Adoption




- Representatives from various stakeholder groups (i.e. teachers, administrators, union leadership) attended 3 meetings in the spring to discuss the direction for ELA program resources.
- Surveys were distributed and collected from all schools. Focus groups were held at each school.
- Four programs were reviewed by the committee, and circulated at each school for teachers to review.
- Two companies provided presentations to a group of teachers and administrators, who were able to preview materials and ask questions.
- HMH was the resource that was determined by teachers and administrators to be the best resource that fit our needs.

## Standards Alignment for HMH Resources

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- HMH Resources are aligned to various state standards, including the New Jersey State Learning Standards and the Common Core Standards.
- Correlation charts for NJ Standards can be accessed within the online platform.
- Summer Planning work consisted of lesson planning for Module 1 (3 weeks) for grades K-4. These lessons included NJ Standards for each week of plans.
- Teachers are able to work with the District ELA Coaches along with various consultants and the HMH Professional Learning team to assist with aligning lessons in subsequent modules.
- District Curriculum Guides can be found on the website, and are updated to NJSLS and aligned with the HMH Resources.


