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What is SSDS?



- The Student Safety Data System (SSDS) is used to fulfill state and federal reporting requirements.
- Incidents of violence, vandalism, harassment, intimidation, or bullying (HIB), weapons offenses, substance offenses, and any other incidents leading to student removal from our district's six schools are collected and reported to the NJDOE (New Jersey Department of Education) via SSDS.
- All HIB trainings, programs, and other information are collected and reported to the state.

When is the Information Reported?



- The SSDS reporting year is September 1 through June 30.
- There are two reporting periods:
 - Report Period 1- September 1 December 31
 - Report Period 2 January 1 June 30

What is Reported?



- Incidents that meet the Incident Type Definitions (Refer to the next slide)
- Incidents that occur on school grounds while school is in session (including arrival and dismissal) and at school-sponsored functions
- Incidents of harassment, intimidation, and bullying (HIB) that occur off school grounds



- Training for all District Anti-Bullying Specialist and Administrators were provided this year
- Each school's Climate and Culture Committee under the leadership of a building administrator meets to review data and trends in order to create an action plan to improve
- The district's Anti-Bullying Coordinator, meets with the district's Anti-Bullying Specialists to review HIB data to identify ways to improve and address problem areas
- The SEL District Team through the School Based Mental Health Screener Grant (SBMHSG)provides schoolwide and classroom social-emotional educational lessons and intervention for our students. We were able to add additional support for our students through Social Work internships.
- Each school has created a Culture and Climate Goal to respond to the data that has been presented.

High School



Interventions and Restorative Practices to Address Student Culture and Climate Concerns:

- SUCCESS Intervention program for students experiencing academic, behavioral or attendance concerns. Teachers meet 1:1 with students during duty periods and create an action plan.
- Central Intervention Program with embedded reflection and next steps during session
- Weekly debriefing with Assistant Principals and School Monitors to review Code of Conduct data
- Monthly Assistant Principal Attendance Reviews and subsequent meetings with parents and students as needed.
- Utilization of new social workers to conduct individual, group and peer to peer mediation sessions for students. Post Suspension Counseling program as well



- Comets of the Marking Period Themes include resiliency, attendance and most improved
- Teaching staff of the Month Themes centered around Danielson Domain 4
- Creation of Alternative Program to address students Tier III MTSS Needs.
