



## **Hackensack Middle School Spanish 5 Course Syllabus**

### **Mission Statement**

The Hackensack Middle School World Language Mission is to nurture and cultivate culturalism/biliteracy while making connections with diverse backgrounds through inter-disciplinary content rich thematic units. We encourage a love/interest for learning other languages through meaningful experiences that will impact our students' lives and prepare them to be global citizens.

### **Course Description**

Spanish 5 is an exploratory world language course incorporating listening, speaking, reading, and some writing. Students in this course meet on an alternating day one/two cycle (every other day). There is an emphasis on basic Spanish vocabulary and structures, while making use of auditory, visual, and contextual clues. Students are exposed to language, culture and geography of the Spanish-speaking world. Face-to-face exchange as well as technological collaboration enhances the progression of language acquisition and retention. New Jersey Core Curriculum Content Standards (NJCCS) units and learning standards for this level of world language are Novice-Mid.

### **Class Expectations**

- Come to class prepared and on time

- Getting to know one another
- Greetings (formal/informal)
- Seasons/Weather Expressions (Northern and Southern Hemispheres)→Emphasis on specific geographical regions in Spain
- Age/phone number (Practice numbers 0-30/Exposure up to 100)
- Nationality/Origin
- Dining out, mealtimes, healthy food choices/snacks, food tastes, (food pyramid)
- Personal descriptions/Descriptions of others
- Family relationships
- Vowels
- Colors
- Clothing worn in varied geographical landforms (ie. beach/mountains)
- Home activities
- Letter sounds
- Cultural celebrations (ie. Carnaval)

## Materials

## Homework

Homework may be given on occasion as reinforcement to a skill acquired in class.

Homework will be collected and checked. If it is correctly completed, the student will receive a check plus. Partially completed work will earn a check. If it is partially done and no work is shown student will receive a check minus. Any late homework receives check minus as a grade.

Any homework assignment that is given will be displayed in the classroom. It is the student's responsibility to write the homework in the student planner.
